(A) MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING - 1ST STREET AND ROSSER AVENUE SITE REMEDIATION AND LONG TERM MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT

That the City of Brandon enter into the memorandum of understanding with the Province of Manitoba attached to the report of the Manager of Design and Inspection dated August 7, 2007 with respect to both parties negotiating and finalizing a site remediation and long term management agreement to be made between both parties regarding the former Brandon Scrap Ironworks properties at 9 - 1st Street and 17 Pacific Avenue and the former Imperial Oil site at 218 and 308 Pacific Avenue and 123 Rosser Avenue in the City of Brandon.

NO. 6870 TO CREATE AN AFFORDABLE HOUSING FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AMENDMENT, 2ND AND 3RD READINGS

That By-law No. 6870 to create an Affordable Housing Financial Assistance Program to encourage new construction of affordable rental multi-family units in the City of Brandon be amended by:

- 1. adding in Section 1., the following subsections:
 - "(g) ELIGIBLE UNIT means a rental residential unit contained within a building of 3 or more rental units and renting for a maximum of median market rent established annually by CMHC) plus 10% inclusive of all utilities; and
 - (h) QUALIFYING UNIT means an eligible unit that is rented by a tenant whose annual household income does not exceed the current second quintile established by Statistics Canada.";
- 2. deleting Section 2 in its entirety and substituting the following therefor:
 - "2. That a financial assistance program be established for newly constructed affordable multi-family rental units whereby eligible property owners shall receive a tax credit equal to 50% of the municipal portion of the tax bill on qualifying units for a period of twenty (20) years commencing in the year the building is first assessed for taxation purposes.";
- 3. adding in Sub-section 3.(a), after the words: "established annually", the words: "by CMHC";
- 4. adding the following as Sub-section 3.(b):

"3. (b) the annual household income of the tenant shall not exceed the current second quintile established by Statistics Canada";

- 5. re-numbering Sub-sections 3.(b) and (c) to Sub-sections 3.(c) and (d) respectively;
- 6. adding in Sub-section 3.(c), before the words: "residential units", the word: "eligible";

- 7. adding the following as Sections 6, 7 and 8:
 - "6. Rental rates for each residential unit eligible for the real property tax credit and appearing on the annual assessment roll shall be verified annually whereby an income/rent declaration signed by the tenant of each eligible rental unit shall be provided by the landlord/property owner to the Treasury Department prior to April 1 of each calendar year.
 - 7. For newly constructed qualifying residential units that are not recorded on the annual assessment roll of the City of Brandon, application for the real property tax credit must be made to the Treasury Department of the City of Brandon along with the required tenant income/rent declarations no later than 30 days from the date of issue of their supplementary tax bill.
 - 8. The Affordable Housing Financial Assistance Tax Credit shall be applied against the taxes due in each qualifying year.";
- 8. re-numbering Section 7 to Section 9; and
- 9. deleting Schedule A and substituting therefor Schedule A attached to the report of the City Clerk's Office dated August 9, 2007.

NO. 6873 TO CREATE A HOME RENOVATION TAX ASSISTANCE PROGRAM AMENDMENT, 2ND AND 3RD READINGS

That By-law No. 6873 to establish a home renovation tax assistance program in the City of Brandon be amended by:

1. deleting, in Sections 6. and 7 respectively, before the words: "eligible renovation", the word: "proposed";

- 2. adding the following to Section 9.: "Should the eligible residential unit be sold, the new owner shall be entitled to the remaining approved real property tax credit payable as per the terms outlined in this by-law provided they complete and provide to the Treasury Department of the City of Brandon, a new Home Renovation Tax Credit Application Form and meet the eligibility requirements for the tax credit within 60 days of the closing date of the purchase.";
- 3. adding the following as Sub-section 10.(e):
 - "10. (e) the maximum approved tax credit has been applied to the eligible residential tax bill.";
- 4. deleting Schedules A and B to the by-law and substituting therefor Schedules A and B attached to the report of the City Clerk's Office dated August 9, 2007.
