(A) NEW FIRE HALL/EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS CENTRE

- 1. Canadian Pacific Railway informing the Planning Department, in writing, of the track speed in the section of its right-of-way, in its entire width, immediately adjacent to both proposed lots;
- 2. the Planning Department receiving two (2) signed copies of a cross-access agreement allowing both properties to share access to Pacific Avenue from the existing driveway;
- 3. the applicant obtaining a variation order reducing the rear yard of the existing building in proposed Lot 2 to 0.0m;
- 4. the Planning Department receiving two (2) signed copies of an encroachment agreement between the proposed Lot 2 and the remaining CPR right-of-way with respect to the existing former station building;
- 5. the Planning Department receiving one (1) signed copy of an encroachment agreement between the proposed Lot 2 and the City of Brandon with respect to the existing former station building;
- 6. the applicant or owner providing the Planning Department with a report by a qualified person confirming the status of soil contamination of both proposed lots and the proposed 8th Street North right-of-way; and
- 7. confirmation that arrangements have been made for an easement and plan of easement to the satisfaction of Manitoba Hydro and/or Centra Gas Manitoba Inc.

NO. 6884

TO PROVIDE FOR THE LICENSING, CONTROLLING, REGULATING AND SAFETY OF TAXICABS WITHIN THE CITY OF BRANDON AMENDMENT, 2ND AND 3RD READINGS

That Taxi By-Law No. 6884 to provide for the licensing, controlling, regulating, and safety of taxicabs within the City of Brandon be amended by:

- (a) deleting in subsection 2.6(a), the words: "effective until December 31, 2011 only";
- (b) deleting section 2.7 in its entirety and substituting the following therefor:
 - "2.7 An exception to subsection 2.6(a) shall be made if, at the time of passage of this by-law, a company is operating with less than six duly licensed metered taxicabs. Those companies may continue to operate with no fewer vehicles than at the date of passage of this by-law. Should the company augment their fleet size, at any time after passage of this by-law, the new fleet size will replace the existing grandfathered fleet size. Any transfer of company ownership will terminate this exception."

That the by-law be further amended by deleting in subsection 8.1(b), the figure: "\$0.14" and substituting therefor, the figure: "\$0.18".
