That pursuant to Section 173(1) of The Municipal Act, the borrowing of funds from the Bank of Montreal not exceeding \$5,350,000 and a provision for pre-approved electronic funds transfer for payroll processing of a maximum \$3,000,000 by the Bank of Montreal for each payroll cycle, both of which are less than \$61,693,252, being the total taxes and grants in lieu collected in 2009, be authorized, and further that these funds be only used for general operating expenses in the 2010 fiscal year and all sums borrowed pursuant to this resolution be supported by a charge upon the whole of the revenues of the municipality.
