ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

(A) APPEAL HEARING - VARIATION APPLICATION FOR 139 - 4TH STREET (NEUFELD)

Mr. Andrew Mok of the Planning Department appeared before City Council to provide information on the application and the discussion that had taken place at the Planning Commission Public Hearing.

Mr. Daniel Neufeld, son of the applicant, also appeared before City Council in support of the application and to answer any questions. He stated the purpose of the appeal was with respect to the condition imposed for 50% brick work on the facade of the building, which would be cost inhibitive and not consistent with the surrounding buildings.

No further representation was put forward either in support of or in opposition to the application.

(286) CONSULTATION WITH FIRE COMMISSIONER REGARDING FIRE HALL LOCATION

Councillor Black enquired whether or not the Fire Commissioner had been consulted with respect to the location of a new fire hall

At the request of the Chair, the City Manager advised that the Fire Commission had not been involved in the search for a new site for the proposed fire hall. He further reported that if requested, the Fire Commissioners Office could become involved, however with the extensive research and modelling done, the Commissioner indicated his office would have nothing additional to add.

(287) UPDATE ON COMMUNITY CENTRES

Councillor Black enquired if an update could be provided on the status of ice surface availability at the various community centres and hours of operation, as well as information on what steps, if any, the City was taking to help increase volunteer involvement in community centres.

His Worship the Mayor agreed to take this matter under advisement.

(288) INVOLVEMENT WITH LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE FOR CONSTRUCTION OF NEW DAMS AND TRANSMISSION LINES

Councillor Black referred to a Legislative Committee established to review construction of new dams and transmission lines and the converter units that would then be required in this part of the Province. He enquired if the City of Brandon had been involved in any discussions with the Committee in that regard.

His Worship the Mayor advised that the City of Brandon had not been involved with the subject Committee.

Further to the above, Councillor Black enquired if a committee should be set up to discuss the issue with Manitoba Hydro from an economic initiative perspective.

At the request of the Chair, the City Manager advised that the Economic Development Officer could consider the possible opportunities in conjunction with Team Brandon.

LONG TERM VIEW OF ECONOMIC/SOCIAL DEVELOPMENTS IN SOUTHWESTERN (289)**MANITOBA**

Councillor Black advised that several people had raised an issue regarding the need for a long term view of economic social development in Southwestern Manitoba. He enquired if an organization such as the Association of Manitoba Municipalities (AMM) or the Southwest Regional Development Corporation could be approached to assist in the organization of a workshop in Brandon over the next six to nine months to consider the issue.

At the request of the Chair, the City Manager advised that the Economic Development Officer was currently reviewing the opportunities for funding with respect to the economic development component of the Community Strategic Plan.

In conjunction with the above, Councillor Black indicated that the vision had to include the entire southwestern region of the Province and suggested AMM might be the most experienced resource to involve.
