Blight-Harwood

HEARING OF DELEGATIONS:

(A) GLEN KRUCK - CANADIAN MENTAL HEALTH ASSOCIATION RENTAL HOUSING SURVEY

Glen Kruck, Regional Manager of the Canadian Mental Health Association, appeared before City Council to present the findings of a November 2008 rental housing survey. He presented graphs which showed a trend of a steady decrease in the availability of affordable rental housing in the City of Brandon, with the current vacancy rate at 0% for the lowest rental rates for one bedroom apartments.

(B) JANE HUNT - RED CROSS WATER SAFETY PROGRAMS

Jane Hunt of the Canadian Red Cross appeared before City Council with respect to the delivery of water safety programs in the City of Brandon. She presented a powerpoint presentation explaining the current partnership agreement in place between the Red Cross and the City of Brandon for the delivery of water safety programs and provided an outline of the impact to the community and surrounding trading area when programming transfers to the YMCA. She requested that City Council continue to support dual programming and include same in its negotiations with the YMCA.

That the presentation by Jane Hunt with respect to the current partnership agreement in place between the Red Cross and the City of Brandon for the delivery of water safety programs and possible remedies to address the impact to the community and surrounding trading area when programming transfers to the YMCA be received. CARRIED.

(C) LORI-LYNN HOLOVACH - PUBLIC PETITION TO SAVE SPORTSPLEX POOL

Lori-lynn Holovach appeared before City Council with respect to the proposed closure of the Sportsplex pool. She presented a petition signed by 452 people opposed to the closure of the pool. Ms. Holovach requested that the proposed indoor soccer facility for the Sportsplex be moved to another location in the City of Brandon.

ENQUIRIES:

(502) SHELTER ALLOWANCE

Councillor McCrae referred to a comment made by Mr. Glen Kruck in his presentation earlier in the evening whereby Mr. Kruck noted that City Council had previously adopted a resolution regarding the Provincial Social Assistance Shelter Allowance Rates. He enquired if a copy of same could be provided and further, whether or not it was within the jurisdiction of City Council to lobby the Provincial Government to raise those rates.

His Worship the Mayor advised that lobbying efforts on behalf of the citizens of Brandon to the Provincial Government was within the jurisdiction of City Council. He confirmed City Council's past resolution with respect to the above and ensured that a copy of same would be provided.

(503) 2005 OVERLAND FLOODING

Councillor Paterson requested an update on the status of the efforts regarding disaster relief funding for the July 2005 overland flooding.

His Worship the Mayor advised that the lobbying efforts with the Federal Government had not been successful, and further, that any enquiries were to be forwarded to Mr. Merv Tweed, Member of Parliament who continued to lobby on behalf of the citizens of Brandon.

Further to this issue, Councillor Paterson enquired if this matter had been and/or could be pursued with the Federation of Canadian Municipalities.

His Worship the Mayor advised that lobbying efforts by the Federation of Canadian Municipalities had also been unsuccessful.

(504) <u>RED CROSS PRESENTATION</u>

Councillor Paterson referred to the presentation by the Red Cross at this evening's meeting whereby they had requested the support of City Council in their efforts to secure a partnership agreement with the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) to continue to provide its water safety programs. He enquired when a report on the Sportsplex/YMCA issue was expected to be presented to City Council. He added that a comparison graph of the programs currently offered at the Sportsplex and those to be offered at the new YMCA would be beneficial as part of that report.

At the request of the Chair, the City Manager advised that the issues presented by the Red Cross, as well as all previous issues raised, including feedback from the meetings with the affected user groups, were to be included in a comprehensive report to City Council at the January 19, 2009 meeting, and further, that same was to contain a programming comparison graph.

Further to this issue, Councillor Black advised that he was of the understanding that accommodations were to be made at the new YMCA Facility for all groups who currently held programs at the Sportsplex pool. He requested that information on how those groups were to be accommodated be included in the above mentioned report.

His Worship the Mayor advised that there had been no guarantee that all programs would be continued at the new facility, however, every attempt was being made to accommodate all affected user groups and the community as a whole.

(505) REFUSE COLLECTION - 500 BLOCK 13TH STREET

Councillor Rice advised that he had received a complaint from a resident in the 500 Block of 13th Street who had reported that numerous calls to the Sanitation Department with respect to her garbage not having been picked up had resulted in no response from that department. He requested that this issue be addressed by the Sanitation Department.

His Worship the Mayor requested that Councillor Rice provide his office with the resident's contact information and assured him that the individual would be contacted to have the issue resolved in a very timely manner.

(506) <u>UPDATE ON KEYSTONE CENTRE REVIEW</u>

Councillor Fitzpatrick requested an update on the review of the Keystone Centre.

At the request of the Chair, the City Manager advised that the City portion of the report had been drafted, dialogue continued with the Province on the issue, and a full report was expected to be presented early in 2009.

(507) CITY POLICY - RESERVE FUNDS AND EXPENDITURES

Councillor Fitzpatrick referred to a document previously distributed to City Council with respect to the the City's policy on reserve funds and expenditures. He noted that the Chamber of Commerce had questioned that policy and enquired if a copy of same could be forwarded to them, with a request that the Chamber review the document and provide feedback.

His Worship the Mayor agreed to take this matter under advisement.

Further to this issue, Councillor Black enquired if this document could be posted on the City Page in the Brandon Sun and all citizens invited to share their comments and/or concerns on the policy.

His Worship the Mayor agreed to take this matter under advisement.

(508) ST. MICHAEL'S ACADEMY COMMEMORATIVE CROSS

Councillor Black noted that St. Michael's Academy had been located at the corner of 1st Street and Victoria Avenue East for over 100 Years prior to it being knocked down and replaced with Victoria Landing. He advised that a commemorative cross located on the grounds had been removed with the intent that it was to be integrated into a park on the site once construction was completed. He enquired if the whereabouts of the cross as well as the placement of same on the site could be investigated by the Municipal Heritage Committee.

At the request of the Chair, Councillor Harwood, Chair of the Municipal Heritage Committee, responded that this matter would be investigated by the Committee.

(510) PARTNERSHIP WITH ASSINIBOINE COMMUNITY COLLEGE

Councillor Campbell enquired if Assiniboine Community College had ever been contacted regarding a partnership with the Red Cross and/or the City of Brandon for any form of instructional programming.

His Worship the Mayor advised that discussions were ongoing with Assiniboine Community College regarding a training partnership, however, none had included any programs relating to water safety.

(511) BURNT OUT STREET LIGHT

Councillor Campbell advised that she had received a call from a ward resident who had contacted Manitoba Hydro several times in regards to a burnt out street light, however, the light had not yet been repaired. She noted that she too, had contacted Manitoba Hydro on behalf of the resident with no results. She enquired as to what steps could be taken to have this issue resolved.

His Worship the Mayor requested that this information be forwarded to the Engineering Department who would follow up with Manitoba Hydro.

(512) PATRICIA AVENUE WALKING PATH - REFUSE CONTAINER AND LIGHTS

Councillor Campbell referred to the new walking path adjacent to Patricia Avenue and advised that residents were very happy with same. She enquired if doggie waste receptacles and more lighting could be provided along the path.

His Worship the Mayor agreed to take this matter under advisement.

ANNOUNCEMENTS:

FACT SHEET - FIRE HALL AND POLICE BUILDING COSTS

Councillor Paterson referred to the Fire Hall and Police Building Costs Information Fact Sheet released recently as information for citizens and announced additional information on the issue. He advised that the cost of \$367 per square foot for the construction of the new Fire Hall was comparable with other cities such as Surrey, BC at \$313 per square foot, and Ajax, ON at \$428 per square foot He added that comparisons were similar for the new Police Building whereby the estimated cost of the Brandon building was \$304 per square foot, compared to Hamilton, ON (2004 figures) at \$247 per square foot and the Winnipeg East District Police Station at \$363 per square foot

Further to this issue, His Worship the Mayor announced that under municipal law, the City of Brandon was required to take the high end estimate as a cost to cover the borrowing request to the Provincial Government, with the hope that the actual construction costs came in lower.

(A) 2009 BORROWING

Considered was a report from the General Manager of Corporate Services dated December 2, 2008 with respect to the above.
