ADOPTION OF AGENDA:

Rice-Harwood

That the Agenda for the Regular Meeting of City Council to be held on Monday, January 9, 2012 be adopted as presented. CARRIED.

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES:

Blight-Chaboyer

That the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of City Council held Monday, December 19, 2011 be taken as read, all statutory requirements having been fulfilled. CARRIED.

HEARING OF DELEGATIONS:

(A) CHAD STILES, MANITOBA RODEO COWBOYS ASSOCIATION - WHEAT CITY STAMPEDE

Chad Stiles of the Manitoba Rodeo Cowboys Association (MRCA) appeared before City Council to provide a power point presentation on the MRCA and the Wheat City Stampede held annually at the Keystone Centre. Mr. Stiles noted that this event had been held in Brandon for past 30 years and advised that the dates for the 4-day Wheat City Stampede were currently being negotiated for some time in late-October at Brandon's Keystone Centre.

Harwood-Isleifson

That the presentation by Chad Stiles of the Manitoba Rodeo Cowboys Association with respect to the Wheat City Stampede held annually at the Keystone Centre be received. CARRIED.

PUBLIC HEARINGS:

(A) <u>VARIATION APPLICATION - 19 GRASSLAND CRESCENT (R & M HOMES)</u>

City Council sat to hear representation on the appeal of the Planning Commission's decision to reject the variation application of R & M Homes for 19 Grassland Crescent.

Mark Bailey appeared on behalf of R & M Homes. Mr. Bailey stated that there had been a misunderstanding on his part as to how the process worked. He noted that because he was constructing a different style of home with a walk-out, there was confusion as to what the restrictions were on the depth and height of a deck. Mr. Bailey stated that he was willing to construct a 6' opaque privacy railing to the satisfaction of neighbors at 21 Grassland.

Ryan Nickel, Community Planner appeared before City Council to discuss the proposed conditions to the approval of the variation whereby he confirmed that any conditions imposed would run with the property.

Berry-McCrae

That the Public Hearing on the variation application by R & M Homes for 19 Grassland Crescent be concluded. CARRIED.

Berry-No Seconder

- That the variation application of Mark Bailey of R & M Homes, on behalf of the owners, Kevin Holder and Angela McGuire-Holder to increase the allowable projection for a balcony into the required 7.6m (25') rear yard from 1.5m (5') to 4.3m (14') at 19 Grassland Crescent (Lot 27, Block 1, Plan 49319) in the RSF Residential Single Family Zone be approved whereby such approval is hereby granted:
 - (a) in accordance with the intent of the application dated September 15, 2011, the letter of intent dated September 12, 2011 and the attached site plan (S1); and
 - (b) subject to the applicant submitting revised construction plans for the balcony to the Planning and Building Department for review and approval with such plans to include a 1.8m (6') privacy railing on the south side of the balcony and having to be signed by both property owners of 17 Grassland Crescent and 21 Grassland Crescent. ENQUIRIES:

(193) PREVIOUS ENQUIRIES - INCREASE IN NUMBER OF IMPAIRED DRIVERS AND VIOLENT CRIMES (ASSAULTS)

Councillor Isleifson referred to his previous enquiry on the recent increase in the number of impaired drivers in the City of Brandon. Councillor McCrae had enquired on the number of violent crimes (assaults) within the City of Brandon in recent months. Her Worship the Mayor had agreed to take both of these matters under advisement.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, Brandon Police Service Acting Inspector Doug Thompson provided a verbal and written report on the above enquiries, a copy of which is attached as the response to Councillor's Enquiry No. 187. He noted that the statistics for impaired drivers were current, however, the exact numbers regarding violent crimes (assaults) would not be available until mid-February 2012.

Councillor Isleifson then enquired as to the relationship between the increase in the number of impaired driving charges and the new Reduce Impaired Driving (RID) Program where the public was encouraged to call 911 to report suspected impaired drivers.

Acting Inspector Thompson responded that there had been a significant increase in the amount of calls coming in reporting suspected impaired drivers and that same had resulted in a substantial increase in the amount of charges being laid. Acting Inspector Thompson stated that if an intoxicated person was seen exiting a vehicle and entering a residence or business, they should be reported to the Brandon Police Service at 729-2345. He added that if however the person was spotted driving the vehicle, the call should go directly to 911 for an immediate response.

(194) REVIEW OF PROCESSES - BUDGET DELIBERATIONS

Councillor Chaboyer enquired if a review of the processes followed in budget deliberations could be undertaken prior to the commencement of the 2013 deliberations.

Her Worship the Mayor agreed to take this matter under advisement.

(195) ROADMAP FOR GROWTH - ADDITION TO RURAL OUTREACH INITIATIVES

Councillor Chaboyer referred to the City of Brandon's Roadmap for Growth and enquired if social programs currently being worked on by committees of City Council such as the Poverty Committee could be added to the Rural Outreach Initiatives Pillar.

Her Worship the Mayor agreed to take this matter under advisement.

(196) UPDATE ON ENQUIRY - SALARY IMPACT ON BUDGET

Councillor Berry requested an update on his previous enquiry for a survey of Western Canadian cities, comparable in size to the City of Brandon, to determine the percentage of their budgets allocated to salaries, wages and benefits.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, Nathan Peto, the City's Policy Analyst, provided a presentation on the matter, a copy of which is attached as the response to Councillor's Enquiry No. 190.

General Manager of Development Services for the City of Brandon be appointed to the Little Souris Sub-District of the Assiniboine Hills Conservation District with term of office to commence April 1, 2012 and end November 30, 2013 for Councillor Fawcett and November 30, 2014 for T.E. Snure. CARRIED.

That the bid of ABC Fire & Safety for the supply 25 self-contained breathing apparatus harnesses, 75 high pressure cylinders, 70 face pieces, 15 voice amplifiers, 7 radio interfaces and 1 Quantifit adapter as per the proposal and specifications at a total cost of \$160,885.70 (excluding GST) be accepted. BY-LAWS:

NO. 7008 TO CREATE A MUNICIPAL TAX INCREMENT FINANCING PROGRAM FOR DOWNTOWN BRANDON

It was noted that this by-law received first reading at the December 19, 2011 meeting of City Council.

Roberts-Isleifson

- That By-law No. 7008, to create a municipal tax increment financing program for Downtown Brandon, be amended by:
 - (1) adding the following as the third "Whereas" clause in the preamble:
 - "AND WHEREAS the tax increment financing program shall be utilized to overcome existing barriers that hinder development in the Downtown HUB";
 - (2) deleting the definition in Section 1. (a) for BASE YEAR in its entirety;
 - (3) adding in Section 3 the following as clause (c):
 - "(c) barriers that hinder development must be overcome in order for the development to occur";
 - (4) deleting Section 6 in its entirety and substituting the following therefor:
 - "6. Applications may be made to access money in the reserve fund to provide financial assist to persons who invest in developing property in the area including:
 - (a) the person in whose name the community revitalization property is assessed;
 - (b) an occupier of the community revitalization property;
 - (c) the municipality in which the community revitalization property is situated.";
 - (5) deleting in Section 9 the words: "attached as "Schedule C" Tax Increment Financing Program Application Form to this by-law", and substituting therefor the words: "provided by the Economic Development Department of the City of Brandon or designate.";
 - (6) deleting Section 10 in its entirety and substituting the following therefor:
 - "10. Funding for each community revitalization property through the tax increment financing program will be available for a maximum of eight (8) years, and will be determined on a project by project basis. Funds will only be paid after the collection of the community revitalization levy."; and
 - (7) adding to Schedule "B" under <u>Section C. Administrative Procedure</u>, the following:
 - "4. If the applicant is not the property owner, written authorization from the property owner(s) is required to apply for financial assistance.". CARRIED.

Roberts-Isleifson

That By-law No. 7008, to create a municipal tax increment financing program for Downtown Brandon, as amended, be read a second time. CARRIED.

Roberts-Isleifson

That the by-law be read a third and final time. CARRIED.
