# (A) AGE FRIENDLY COMMITTEE VERBAL

SEPTEMBER 3, 2013

Councillor Berry reported that the Age Friendly Committee had held its first meeting on August 27, 2013 and that Dayle Hughson had been appointed as Chair, and Jack Jacobsen as Vice-Chair.

# (B) BRANDON MUNICIPAL HERITAGE ADIVSORY COMMITTEE VERBAL

SEPTEMBER 3, 2013

September 3, 2013 Brandon, Manitoba

Mayor and Councillors City of Brandon

Councillor Roberts reported that the dedication ceremony in honour of Brandon's Veterans' Memorial would be held from 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, September 14, 2013 at the memorial site at 1010 Victoria Avenue (Brandon Police Services Lot). He noted that a reception would follow at the Brandon Armoury and that everyone was invited to join in celebrating this achievement.

### **ENQUIRIES:**

# (455) RESURFACING OF VICTORIA AVENUE

Councillor Harwood noted that the resurfacing of Victoria Avenue between 18th and 34th Streets was now complete and enquired when the lines at the crosswalks were expected to be painted.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the lines were expected to be completed in the current week but agreed to follow-up on this matter.

#### (456) PRIORITY OF CITY INFRASTRUCTURE PROJECTS

Councillor Berry noted that infrastructure projects were planned and prioritized by City of Brandon staff and enquired as to the possibility of delaying a planned project to address a more urgent issue which had the potential to affect residents' personal property or homes.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that projects aimed at protecting personal property and homes had always taken priority. He noted however, that dependant on the time of year and availability of contractors to complete the work; it was not always possible to change priorities quickly. He added that future infrastructure projects could also be discussed and planned for during budget deliberations.

Councillor Berry referred to a recent weather event which had resulted in damage to personal property to residents in both his and Councillor LoRegio's wards. He enquired if funds set aside for a future infrastructure project could be redirected towards addressing this issue.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager confirmed that this issue could be discussed at the upcoming budget deliberations.

# (457) SUPPORT FOR A NEW SCHOOL IN CITY OF BRANDON

Councillor Montague noted that City Council, by resolution, had supported the Brandon School Division's request to the Province of Manitoba for another elementary school in the City of Brandon. He advised that all the new construction in the south end of the City had further added to the shortage of space and requested an update on the status of this request to the Province of Manitoba.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that letters outlining City Council's support of the Brandon School Division's request for a new K-8 School for the City of Brandon had been forwarded to The Honourable Greg Selinger, Premier of Manitoba, The Honourable Nancy Allen, Minister of Education and the Chair of the Public Schools Finance Board by Mayor Decter Hirst on March 8, 2012. He advised that on May 22, 2012 a response had been received from The Honourable Nancy Allen who had confirmed that the Brandon School Division had requested approval of a new school in south Brandon as early as 2015/2016 when the Division had submitted its five year capital plan to her Department. He noted that the Minister of Education planned to work closely with the Brandon School Division to ensure that its needs were met.

Her Worship the Mayor requested that this enquiry and the response to same be forwarded to the City of Brandon/Brandon School Division Joint Task Force as information.

### (458) ONE WAY TRAFFIC AND BARRICADES ON 9TH AND 10TH STREETS

Councillor Montague referred to a previous enquiry by Councillor Isleifson with respect to the one way traffic and barricades on 9th and 10th Streets and noted that a report on this issue was expected in the near future. He enquired if the option of removing the barricades and reverting back to two-way traffic on those streets could also be considered in the report.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager confirmed that the report, inclusive of an option to revert back to the traffic flows in place prior to 2011, would be presented at the September 16, 2013 City Council meeting.

# (459) DESIGNATION OF PROPERTY AT 2105 BRANDON AVENUE AS SURPLUS AFFORDABLE HOUSING

Councillor Chaboyer enquired if a report could be provided on the possibility of designating the city-owned property located at 2105 Brandon Avenue as Surplus Affordable Housing.

# (A) REVIEW OF DISASTER FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS

### Chaboyer-LoRegio

WHEREAS municipalities continue to face a significant threat from massive storm damage to municipal infrastructure, and its commercial and residential properties within its jurisdiction;

AND WHEREAS already financially burdened municipalities and their citizens do not have the resources to respond quickly to the damage caused by these storms, or the funds to undertake preventative actions;

AND WHEREAS governments are unable to respond quickly enough or allow a consistent level of access to disaster financial assistance for municipalities and its citizens;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Association of Manitoba Municipalities (AMM) lobby the governments of Canada and Manitoba and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities (FCM) for a review of the current policies for disaster financial assistance programs and/or to increase funding to and/or expand the criteria for eligibility to these programs, in order to allow municipalities more rapid and consistent access to funding. CARRIED.
