HEARING OF DELEGATIONS:

(A) <u>TOM KEEP AND CHRIS HEIDI - EARTH DAY ACTIVITIES</u>

Tom Keep and Chris Heidi, on behalf of the Brandon Environment Committee appeared before City Council with respect to the activities planned for the local Earth Day Celebrations. Mr. Keep informed City Council that the annual event, which promotes a healthy and sustainable environment, was set this year for Sunday, April 27, in Princess Park. He noted that highlights of this year's planned celebrations included free refreshments, free compost and seed packet giveaways, various children's activities, landfill tours with free shuttle service from Princess Park, bike safety, build-your-own rain barrel and automobile "Eco Check" workshops, and a variety of educational displays. Mr. Keep advised that in the event of inclement weather on April 27, Earth Day Celebrations would be staged in the Main Foyer at City Hall.

(B) LAUREL GOULDEN-JAMES - HOME BASED BUSINESS APPLICATION FOR 1057 SYCAMORE DRIVE (PHYSCIAL REHAB/MASSAGE THERAPY)

Laurel Goulden-James appeared before City Council with respect to her operating a physical rehabilitation/massage therapy service as a home based business at 1057 Sycamore Drive. Ms. Golden-James indicated her proposal was to expand the services currently provided via her business, Golden Touch Massage Therapy, with the home based business acting as a satellite location in a part-time capacity. She confirmed to City Council that the proposed satellite clinic in her home passed a Public Health inspection and had not been met with any neighbourhood opposition.

(C) CHIEF OF POLICE I. GRANT - 2013 BRANDON POLICE SERVICE YEAR END REVIEW

Mark Frison, Chair of the Brandon Police Board and Chief Ian Grant of Brandon Police Services appeared before City Council with an update on 2013 year end statistics from the Brandon Police Service. Chief Grant noted that 2013 saw an approximate 2.5% increase in calls for service however, crimes against persons were down by approximately 7%, property crimes were down by approximately 6%, and the other crimes category - including weapons offences and impaired driving – saw a decrease of 5%. He indicated that the incidences of drug offences increased by 37% in 2013, due to an increase in trafficking arrests and added that poor winter conditions and increased traffic flow likely led to an increase in accident statistics of 22% over 2012. Chief Grant noted that the focus in 2014 would continue to be on community and staff consultation, pro-active community mobilization, and working with the Brandon Police Board to renew the Service's Strategic Plan.

(A) <u>BRANDON GENERAL MUSEUM AND ARCHIVES INC.</u> APRIL 7, 2014

Mayor and Councillors City of Brandon

Councillor Berry provided a report and power point presentation on the activities of the Brandon General Museum and Archives Inc. (BGMA). He noted that the museum continued to feature the B.J Hales Museum collection and numerous historical City Hall artifacts on permanent display, while featuring a travelling exhibit until the end of June highlighting Sir Arthur Currie, who served in World War I as a senior military officer. Councillor Berry stated that the museum planned to host its third annual fundraiser this coming September 11, 2014 at Sokol Hall, and that future plans for the BGMA included rotating collection displays on a bi-annual basis with a combination of local artifacts and travelling exhibits related to Brandon's history; continuing to pursue group and school tours to enhance visitation numbers to the museum; and potentially setting aside funds from fundraising and donations to find a larger, more permanent space for the museum.

On behalf of the BGMA Board of Directors, Councillor Berry then presented Her Worship Mayor Shari Decter Hirst with a framed print of Brandon's historic Canadian Pacific Railway station as an appreciative token of City Council's continued support for the museum.

(542) <u>2014 SPRING FLOOD FORECAST</u>

Councillor Fawcett requested an update on the City's 2014 Spring Flood Forecast.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that, due to above normal soil moisture, there was a risk of minor to moderate flooding in the recreation areas along the Assiniboine River, however, the flood protection plans were in place and the City of Brandon was well prepared for spring.

(543) IMPACT OF FIREFIGHTERS' AND PARMAMEDICS' ASSOCIATION ARBITRATION

Councillor LoRegio advised that he had received phone calls from residents concerned with the outcome of the recent Brandon Firefighters' and Paramedics' Association arbitration hearings. He enquired as to the options available to the City of Brandon should the award be higher than budgeted for in 2014.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the decision, which was expected to take 2 to 3 months, was binding and the City of Brandon was responsible for the execution of the details. He stated that going forward, it was important to focus on the future of the fire service and the relationship between the City and the union.

(544) POOLING OF WATER IN BACK LANE BETWEEN 25TH AND 26TH STREETS FROM J.R. REID SCHOOL TO VAN HORNE AVENUE

Councillor LoRegio advised that water was pooling in the back lane between 25th and 26th Streets from J.R. Reid School to Van Horne Avenue and had now started to overflow into residents' yards. He enquired if this problem could be addressed as soon as possible.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager confirmed that this issue had been brought to his attention earlier in the day and crews had already been dispatched to the area.

Further to this issue, the City Manager advised that crews continued to work on drainage issues in all areas of the City. He encouraged residents to contact the Public Works Department at (204) 729-2285 to report any problem areas.
