**ADOPTION OF AGENDA:**

**HEARING OF DELEGATIONS:**

(A) RAY ESSIAMBRE, INFRA-CYCLE FISCAL SOLUTIONS - FISCAL IMPACT ANALYSIS  
FOR CITY OF BRANDON

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Ray Essiambre of Infra-cycle Fiscal Solutions appeared before City Council with respect to the results of the City's recent Fiscal Impact Analysis, which was a detailed examination of all municipal, capital, maintenance, and operating costs associated with land use development projects. Mr. Essiambre highlighted the recently-completed Fiscal Baseline results and how it could be used to evaluate future land use plans and policies. He reported that he believed the current approach to funding development growth was not sustainable and recommended changes in the City of Brandon's land use strategy, evaluation of revenue sources, and amounts of financial support provided by new developments.

That the presentation by Ray Essiambre of Infra-cycle Fiscal Solutions with respect to the findings from the creation of a fiscal baseline for the City of Brandon, and the next steps the City could take to improve its financial performance be received. CARRIED.

(B) PHIL DORN - ACQUISITION OF FORMER CENTRAL FIRE HALL #1

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City Council received a presentation from Mr. Phillip Dorn with respect to the former Central Fire Hall #1 which he was slated to take possession of on January 15, 2015. Mr. Dorn reviewed his updated plans for the building and suggested that the original bell remain under ownership by the City of Brandon, but be displayed at street level at the former Central Fire Hall #1 site. Mr. Dorn also requested that the City of Brandon provide construction of a new sidewalk in front of the property and allow for changes on the condition to purchase regarding caveats on the property.

COMMUNITY QUESTION PERIOD:

GERRY KEMP - DELIVERY OF MAIL TO HOUSEHOLDS BETWEEN 18TH AND 26TH STREETS  
ALONG MCDONALD AVENUE

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Mr. Gerry Kemp appeared before City Council and advised that the residents along McDonald Avenue between 18th and 26th Streets had received notice from Canada Post that due to safety concerns, mail delivery to households would stop in the very near future. He advised that the residents were to be given 2 weeks notice as to when the door to door delivery would be replaced with a community mailbox. Mr. Kemp cited the lack of a sidewalk and the build-up of snow in the winter along the south side of McDonald Avenue as the reasons for the changes. He requested City Council's assistance with this matter.

Her Worship the Mayor noted that this matter would be raised under the Order of Enquiries.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

(A) AUDIT AND FINANCE COMMITTEE SEPTEMBER 15, 2014

Councillor Fawcett reported on the 2013 City of Brandon Audited Financial Statements which had recently been reviewed and approved by the Audit and Finance Committee. Dean Hammond, General Manager of Corporate Services, presented a power point presentation on the 2013 Audited Statements. He noted the changes in reporting under PSAB (Public Sector Accounting Board) standards which focused on the net worth of the organization with consideration of all the assets and liabilities. He stated that in 2013, the City of Brandon reported an increase in its net worth of \$19.4 Million resulting in an accumulated surplus of \$344.3 Million for 2013 with an actual budgetary surplus of \$2.7Million.

The General Manager of Corporate Services agreed to provide a breakdown to City Council of the significant drivers of the 2013 year-end budget surplus.

(B) WESTERN MANITOBA CENTENNIAL AUDITORIUM  
VERBAL SEPTEMBER 15, 2014

Councillor Isleifson provided a verbal report from the Western Manitoba Centennial Auditorium (WMCA) Board of Directors. He advised that about 90% of the roofing repairs to the WMCA building had been completed and that the Board would be creating a reserve to fund future projects of a capital nature not covered in a normal operational annual budget. Councillor Isleifson commented that the facility had been very active with new events and that online tickets sales, due to an updated website, had substantially improved.

(C) POVERTY COMMITTEE  
VERBAL SEPTEMBER 15, 2014

Councillor Chaboyer reported on the meeting of the Poverty Committee held September 9, 2014. She noted that the Poverty Committee had received a presentation from Susan Cole, Vice-Chair of the Safe and Warm Program who advised that the temporary shelter had operated 97 nights last year and provided shelter to over 57 different people. Ms. Cole had advised that in 2014, the program would operate out of the Samaritan House and was looking for funding to support the program. Councillor Chaboyer also outlined the priorities of the Poverty Committee including healthy food initiatives, operating a website, and looking at a more permanent shelter for the homelessness in the community.

1698 Harwood-Isleifson  
That the reports of the Western Manitoba Centennial Auditorium and the Poverty Committee be received. CARRIED.

ENQUIRIES:

(609) POSTAL SERVICE BETWEEN 18TH AND 26TH STREETS

Councillor Harwood referred to remarks by Mr. Gerry Kemp earlier in the meeting whereby Mr. Kemp had advised that Canada Post would cease door-to-door mail delivery on the south side of McDonald Avenue from 18th to 26th Streets in the very near future, citing safety concerns as the reason for same. Councillor Harwood advised that with no sidewalk along the south side of McDonald Avenue between 18th and 26th Streets and the build-up of snow from the ploughing efforts in the winter months, mail carriers felt unsafe walking door-to-door in the area. He further advised that the speed of traffic along McDonald Avenue also continued to be a problem and enquired if these issues could be investigated.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager agreed to follow up with both the Engineering Department and the Brandon Police Service on the sidewalk and speeding issues. He agreed to contact Canada Post to discuss the issue, however, he noted that the City of Brandon had very little control over the corporate decisions of Canada Post.

(610) LEFT HAND TURN SIGNALS AT 26TH STREET AND VICTORIA AVENUE

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Councillor Harwood enquired if left-hand turn signals at the intersection of 26th Street and Victoria Avenue for east and west bound traffic had been considered in the traffic study conducted in partnership with Manitoba Infrastructure and Transportation in 2013.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the intersection of 26th Street and Victoria Avenue was analyzed as part of that study and it had been determined at that time that left-hand turn signals were not warranted at this location.

(611) PAVING OF 00 BLOCKS OF 22ND, 23RD, 24TH AND 25TH STREETS

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Councillor Harwood noted that the 000 Blocks of 22nd Street to 25th Street inclusive were not paved and enquired if same were on the list of projects to be completed at some point.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the 000 Blocks of 22nd Street to 25th Street, north of Rosser Avenue had been on the list of potential construction projects for some time. He advised that unfortunately, higher traffic areas had taken priority. The City Manager noted that a review of the drainage on each of these streets was required to be able to accommodate any road improvements and that same remained on the list of potential projects for the 2015 construction season.

(612) UPDATE ON THE SETTLEMENT WITH MANITOBA PUBLIC INSURANCE RE: REPAIRS TO THE 8TH STREET BRIDGE

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Councillor Roberts requested an update on the status of the settlement with Manitoba Public Insurance with respect to the repairs to the 8th Street Bridge.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the City of Brandon had received a settlement payment of \$81,000 from Manitoba Public Insurance and noted that this amount covered approximately 80 per cent of the repair costs.

(613) SOLUTIONS TO PEOPLE LIVING UNDER THE BRIDGE

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Councillor Roberts enquired as to possible solutions to the problem of people living under the 8th Street Bridge.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the Brandon Police Service continued to monitor the area very closely and a Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) analysis was currently underway with a report on same expected in the near future. The City Manager noted that as part of the report, it was expected that adjacent property owners would be encouraged to remove the bush in the area and consideration given to having the area under the southernmost portion of the bridge closed-off completely. He also advised that Community Policing members had reached out to other community stakeholders as to possible solutions to the plight of the people who made this area their home. He noted that although great strides had been taken in assisting the homeless in the winter months, this issue was much more than seasonal.

(614) CONDITIONS OF RAMP LEADING UP THE 8TH STREET BRIDGE

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Councillor Roberts noted that the ramp leading up the 8th Street Bridge was in poor condition and enquired when repairs to same were expected to be completed.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the Engineering Department Staff were working on immediate, short-term solutions to this problem with a proposal for a more permanent solution to be included in the 2015 Budget.

Further to this issue, Her Worship Mayor Decter Hirst enquired when the street lights in the area were expected to be repaired.

The City Manager responded that Manitoba Hydro had been requested to have these repairs completed as soon as possible.

(615) 3-WAY STOP SIGN AT THE INTERSECTION OF 8TH STREET AND PACIFIC AVENUE

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Councillor Roberts noted that he had received numerous calls requesting that the installation of the 3-Way Stop Sign at the intersection of 8th Street and Pacific Avenue remain in place permanently.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the stop signs had been very effective in slowing traffic along Pacific Avenue and that the Traffic Engineer was currently considering a traffic proposal that included all of Pacific Avenue, inclusive of improvements to the crosswalk in front of Westman Immigrant Services.

(616) FUTURE FLOOD PROTECTION

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Councillor Fawcett requested an update on the future flood protection for the City of Brandon.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager agreed to include this issue on his upcoming report to City Council expected no later than the October 20, 2014 meeting.

(617) STATUS OF DUST CONTROL IN BACKLANE SOUTH OF ELVISS CRESCENT - 26TH TO 34TH STREETS

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Councillor LoRegio referred to a previous enquiry with respect to dust control in the back lane south of Elviss Crescent between 26th and 34th Streets and requested an update on the status of same. Councillor LoRegio advised that he had received a petition from area residents in regards to this issue and presented the document to the City Clerk.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the Traffic Engineer was currently evaluating the existing procedure for dust control in all areas of the City of Brandon. He advised that with a current budgeted amount of \$17,400, dust control was currently only applied to high traffic areas such as back lanes around collection depots, public parks, and schools. The City Manager noted that less than 10 per cent of the 99 kilometers of lanes in the city were considered eligible for dust control. He invited Councillor LoRegio to arrange a meeting between area residents and the respective City Departments to discuss this issue further.

(618) SUSPENSION OF HOME MAIL DELIVERY BY CANADA POST

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Councillor Chaboyer enquired if a full report, inclusive of timelines, could be requested from Canada Post with respect to the suspension of home delivery services in the City of Brandon.

Her Worship the Mayor responded that she had spoken with Canada Post immediately following the original announcement of the move to super mailboxes in communities across Canada and had been advised that there was no timeline for implementation set for Brandon at that time. She advised that she continued to monitor the situation and that Canada Post was expected to provide a full report, inclusive of the timelines, to her office prior to any changes being made.

She noted that the situation on McDonald Avenue differed from the original planned changes in that it was a safety concern for the mail carriers, and was not related to the full-scale changes to service.

(619) CONDITION OF 20TH STREET FROM MARYLAND AVENUE TO RICHMOND AVENUE

Councillor Montague advised that 20th Street from Maryland Avenue to Richmond Avenue was in need of repair and enquired if repairs to same were planned in the near future. He also enquired as to the planned repairs to the intersection of 20th Street and Falcon Crescent where a dip in the road was causing concerns for motorists.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that the repairs were not included in the 2014 Capital Plan. He agreed to follow-up with the Engineering Department as to the plans for the future and report back to Councillor Montague.

(620) SIDEWALK ON 20TH STREET TO CONNECT WITH THE WALKING PATH TO BRANDON SHOPPERS' MALL

Councillor Montague requested an update on the planned installation of a sidewalk along 20th Street to connect to the walking path from the Brentwood Trailer Court to the Brandon Shoppers' Mall.

At the request of Her Worship the Mayor, the City Manager responded that information on this issue would be included in the report to be provided with respect to the 20th Street roadway repairs referred to in the previous enquiry.

AFGHANISTAN VIGIL SERVICE AT CANADIAN FORCES BASE (CFB) SHILO

Councillor Harwood announced that he had been honoured to lay a wreath on behalf of the City of Brandon at the Vigil Service held September 9, 2014 at Canadian Forces Base Shilo in recognition of those who had lost their lives in the line of duty in Afghanistan.
